

Demonetisation move has hit interests of common people, says Sobhandeb Chatterjee

KOLKATA: Governor Keshari Nath Tripathi believes West Bengal has regained its past glory since last few years. The governor, who was addressing at foundation stone laying ceremony of regional office of The Associated Chambers of Commerce & Industry of India (ASSOCHAM), said that Bengal is the gateway of South-east Asia. The economic development of Bengal is connected to the country's growth. However, the Governor believes that the Centre's demonetisation drive is a bold step taken to root out the black money from the country. "This is a bold step so let us rule out

the negative thoughts from our mind," Tripathi said. State power minister Sobhandeb Chatterjee, on the other hand said that the demonetisation drive has hit the interests of the common people. "I cannot make any comments on the basis of what the Governor said. I can only put forth my opinion on demonetisation and that is an undemocratic move by Prime Minister Narendra Modi," Chatterjee said adding, "We are not against weeding out black money. But this is certainly not the process where common people are facing the plight. The leader of the nation is somebody who can predict the future. The Prime Minister

failed to predict the troubles of the common people after announcing the demonetisation drive." ASSOCHAM, the 97-year-old apex chamber of the country is all set to strengthen its foothold in East India. The Chamber was established as The Associated Chambers of Commerce & Industry of India and Ceylon in 1920 by a group of Chamber of Commerce led by Calcutta Traders Association.
