## IMG Report on Telcos' Financial Health Likely in 20 Days: Sinha

Telecom minister says govt will take corrective steps based on the report

Kolkata: The inter-ministerial panel looking into the financial health of stressed telcos will submit its report in 20 days, based on which, the government will take corrective steps, Telecom Minister Manoj Sinha said on Wednesday.

"The telecom industry is under financial stress and action will be taken based on the report of the interministerial group," Sinha told Lok Sabha during question hour.

Back in June, the government's inter-ministerial panel on financial health of the telecom industry had met all telecom companies in batches in the run-up to submitting its recommendations to the Centre.

Sinha said the panel has been mandated to examine systemic issues affecting the viability and repayment capacity of the telecom industry, and suggest remedies.

The panel, he said, would also look into policy reforms and strategic interventions for the telecom sector.

A one-time poster child of India's economic progress, the telecoms industry with some ₹5 lakh-crore of

debt has been in dire straits, battling a brutal price war and grappling with unsustainable levels of financial stress. Even the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) had warned that banks ought to keep a close watch on such sectoral loans amid erosion of telco profitability.

In this context, Sinha told Lok Sabha that the sector regulator had also suggested that the telecom department coax the finance ministry to reduce the applicable goods & services tax (GST) for telecom services from 18% to 5% by declaring the in-

dustry a core infrastructure sector.

The telecom regulator, he said, has also suggested that the Centre heed its suggestions of reducing telecom levies and also deferring payouts towards spectrum acquired in auctions to ease financial stress levels of telcos.

In a separate development, telecom secretary Aruna Sundararajan said the communications ministry is setting up working groups this week to give inputs on the new telecom policy.

These working groups, she said, would look at multiple aspects such as ease of doing business, new technologies, affordable internet and broadband for all.

"Initially, we had thought of 11 working groups, but we may compress the total number," Sundararajan said on the sidelines of an Assocham event on Wednesday.

The government is planning to bring out the draft new telecom policy by December.

According to the telecom secretary, India is trying to see how to step up growth from 7.6%. "Our aspiration is to grow at about 10%. So what are the set of policies needed for making that transition? That's the bigger question," she said.

# 'Centre may consider quashing telecom circles'

Telecom Secretary says govt will work towards 'one nation, one network, one licence' policy

The government may soon consider the telecom industry's demand of doing away with telecom circles and will work towards the concept of one nation, one network and one licence.

To communicate this, Telecom Secretary Aruna Sundararajan on Wednesday met telecom operators, infrastructure providers and handset makers here.

Sources close to the development said Sundararajan has assured the industry that the government is committed to bring in changes that will enhance the ease of doing business in the country.

"There will have to be a significant amount of administrative reform in the Telecom Ministry so thatwe are able to actually move to some of the things like one na-

tion (one network and one license policy)," Sundararajan told reporters when asked on the sidelines of an Assocham event here.

However, she added that such things can't happen overnight, but can be put into policy. "What I am saying is that we will endeavour to put it into the policy. We will provide the necessary movement. Others can be the low-hanging fruit and they can be done straight away."

She said the government's approach in the national telecom policy (NTP) will 'facilitate and enable' the sector and that regulation should be such that it incentivises fresh investment. "It will be our (government's) endeavour to see how we can secure a viable rate of return for the industry," she said.

India is not just following but setting best practices in many areas in terms of NTP 2018, she said, adding that "this is something where India is actually ahead of the rest of the world."

She also said the NTP is going to be a key building block in achieving the vision to grow at about 10 per cent from current rate of about 7.6 per cent.

# Will consider one country, one network, one licence policy, ministry tells telcos

FE BUREAU New Delhi, August 2

THE INDUSTRY'S DEMAND of a one nation, one network and one licence policy could become a reality soon as the telecom min-

istry has assured them that it will consider the suggestion and work on it.

Telecom secretary Aruna Sundararajan in her meeting with telecom operators, infrastructure providers and handset makers on the sidelines of an event on Wednesday, also assured the industry that the government is committed to bring in changes that will enhance the ease of doing business.

During the meeting, a representative from the country's largest telecom operator, Bharti Airtel, said that India is ready for a one nation, one network and one licence policy. He added that it is time that bifurcations such as types of licences and geographical split around licensing, circles and service areas are done

away with and that technology should decide the architecture, rather than regulation deciding the architecture.

Responding to the queries raised during the two-hour session, Sundararajan said, "There will have to be a significant amount of rewriting and administrative reform in the telecom ministry, so that we are able to actually move to some of the things like one nation (one network and one licence policy)."

She, however added, "I am

not saying that all this will be done overnight, but what I am saying is that we will endeavour to put it into the policy (NTP), so that those things that need to be done in a calibrated manner, we will provide the necessary movement. Others can be the low-hanging fruit and they can be done straight away".
