# **Cabinet Decisions**

## Cabinet approves the Nutrient Based Subsidy rates for Rabi 2025- 26 on **Phosphatic and Potassic fertilizers**

The Union Cabinet, chaired by Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi, has approved the proposal of the Department of Fertilizers for fixing the Nutrient Based Subsidy (NBS) rates for the Rabi Season 2025-26 (October 2025 to March 2026) on Phosphatic and Potassic (P&K) fertilizers. The estimated budgetary requirement for the season is Rs. 37,952 crore, which is about Rs. 736 crore higher than the Kharif 2025

The subsidy on P&K fertilizers, including Di-Ammonium Phosphate (DAP) and NPKS grades, will be provided at approved rates to ensure their timely and affordable availability to farmers across the country. This decision aims to maintain stability in fertilizer prices and support farmers during the upcoming Rabi season.

The move will ensure the availability of fertilizers to farmers at subsidized and reasonable prices while rationalizing subsidy levels in line with recent international price trends.

Under the NBS Scheme, operational since April 2010, the Government provides 28 grades of P&K fertilizers at subsidized rates through manufacturers and importers. The approval of NBS rates for Rabi 2025-26 reflects the Government's continued commitment to supporting farmers and ensuring affordable access to essential agricultural inputs despite fluctuations in global fertilizer prices.

#### Cabinet approves Terms of Reference of 8th Central Pay Commission

The Union Cabinet, chaired by Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi, has approved the Terms of Reference for the 8th Central Pay Commission.

The 8th Central Pay Commission will be a temporary body comprising a Chairperson, one Part-Time Member, and a Member-Secretary. It will submit its recommendations within 18 months from the date of constitution and may issue interim reports as required. While framing its recommendations, the Commission will consider the overall economic conditions, fiscal prudence, availability of resources for developmental and welfare expenditure, the cost of pension liabilities, the impact on State finances, and the emolument structures in Central Public Sector Undertakings and the private sector.

The Central Pay Commissions are periodically set up to review and recommend changes in the salary structure, retirement benefits, and service conditions of Central Government employees. These recommendations are generally implemented once every ten years. Accordingly, the 8th Central Pay Commission's recommendations are expected to take effect from January 1, 2026.

The Government had announced the formation of the 8th Central Pay Commission in January 2025 to examine and revise the pay and benefits of Central Government employees.

# Overall

#### **CEA projects India's FY26 GDP growth at around 7%**

Chief economic advisor (CEA) V. Anantha Nageswaran expects India's real GDP growth for 2025-26 to be around seven per cent. The economy has held up well against global uncertainties, supported by strong domestic fundamentals and steady policy measures.

#### Reuters' poll predicts FY26 GDP growth at 6.7%

India's real GDP likely grew by 6.7 per cent in 2025-26, according to a Reuters poll of 50 economists conducted between 15 and 24 October 2025. This marks a slight upgrade from 6.6 per cent projected in the September 2025 survey, following a surprise 7.8 per cent expansion in the June 2024 quarter and recent Goods and Services Tax (GST) cuts aimed at boosting demand.

#### Rs.100 bln mission to lift manufacturing's share in GDP to 25%

The central government is planning a Rs.100 billion outlay for the National Manufacturing Mission (NMM) to raise manufacturing's share in GDP to 25 per cent by 2035 from the current 13 per cent, reported Mint. The mission, first announced in the Union Budget 2025-26 with an initial Rs.1 billion allocation, will fund greenfield projects and expand high-value sectors across seven regional clusters.

## Indian importers resume imports of green lentils from US

Indian importers have resumed the imports of green lentils from the US. They had halted purchases of agricultural goods such as lentils and beans from the US during July-September 2025, amid concerns that the Indian government might impose retaliatory measures in response to the punitive tariffs introduced by the Donald Trump administration in August 2025.

This will come into effect from 1 November 2025. This policy shift is aimed at supporting domestic pulse growers before the start of the upcoming kharif season.

#### Air India Express to retrofit 50 Boeing 737-8 aircraft by mid-2026

Air India Express would retrofit 50 of its Boeing 737-8 aircraft by mid-2026, as competition in the budget end of the aviation industry intensifies. The retrofitting involves installing ergonomically designed synthetic leather seats with thicker armrests and improved legroom, in-seat USB-C charging ports, ovens for hot meals, new carpets, and advanced Boeing Sky Interior mood lighting.

#### PSBs to launch Indian digital payment intelligence corporation

Public sector banks (PSBs) are set to launch an Indian digital payments intelligence platform, according to media reports. All 12 state-run banks are expected to take equity stakes in the proposed entity known as the Indian Digital Payment Intelligence Corporation (IDPIC).

#### Blackstone to pick up stake in Federal Bank

Blackstone is set to acquire a 9.99 per cent stake in Federal Bank through warrants for about Rs.62 billion. The bank plans to issue up to 272.9 million warrants to the investor through a private placement. Each warrant will be convertible into one equity share with a face value of Rs.2, at an issue price of Rs.227 per share, which includes a premium of Rs.225.

#### **HPCL** floats fuel import tenders

HP has issued two tenders to import transport fuels for early November 2025 delivery, according to media reports. The company is seeking approximately 34,000 tons of gasoline and 65,000 tons of gasoil for delivery between 1-10 November 2025 at the Mundra port on India's western coast.

#### Copper demand rises 9.3% in 2024-25: ICA India

India's copper demand grew 9.3 per cent to 1,878 kilo tonnes (kt) in 2024-25, up from 1,718 kt a year earlier, according to a report by International Copper Association India (ICA India). The demand growth was supported by an 11 per cent year-on-year (y-o-y) rise in building construction and 17 per cent y-o-y increase in infrastructure.

## Govt aligns medical device packaging norms with Medical Devices **Rules, 2017**

The government has amended the Legal Metrology (Packaged Commodities) Rules, 2025, introducing provisions that align packaging and labelling norms for medical devices with the Medical Devices Rules, 2017. The revision removes regulatory overlap by giving precedence to medical device-specific standards over general packaging rules, particularly regarding font dimensions and labelling requirements.

# Andhra Pradesh

#### Andhra Pradesh govt to develop inland waterways with IWAI

The Andhra Pradesh government and Inland Authority of India (IWAI) have entered into an agreement for the development of inland waterways in the state. As a part of it, the IWAI will invest more than Rs.1.5 billion for strengthening inland waterways in the state and equip the state government with a Vessel Traffic Management System (VTMS) and navigational aid.

# International Developments

#### Prime Minister's participation in the 22nd ASEAN-India Summit

Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi participated virtually in the ASEAN-India Summit and underscored that an early review of the ASEAN-India FTA (AITIGA) would unlock the full economic potential of the partnership and enhance regional cooperation. Aligning with Malaysia's theme of "Inclusivity and Sustainability," he announced continued support for implementing the ASEAN-India Plan of Action (2026-2030), adoption of the Joint Leaders' Statement on Sustainable Tourism as part of the ASEAN-India Year of Tourism, and designation of 2026 as the "ASEAN-India Year of Maritime Cooperation" to advance blue-economy collaboration. The Prime Minister proposed holding the second ASEAN-India Defence Ministers' Meeting and Maritime Exercise. He highlighted training for 400 renewable-energy professionals to support the ASEAN Power Grid, extension of Quick Impact Projects to Timor-Leste, and the establishment of a Centre for Southeast Asian Studies at Nalanda University. PM also reiterated India's commitment to cooperation in areas such as education, energy, science and technology, fintech, and cultural heritage.

#### ADB Approves \$460 Million loan to support Agricultural Solarization in India

The Asian Development Bank (ADB) has approved a \$460 million results-based loan to upgrade rural power infrastructure in Maharashtra, boost distributed renewable energy, and ensure farmers receive reliable daytime solar power for irrigation. The initiative, called the Maharashtra Power Distribution Enhancement Program for Agricultural Solarization, supports the state's Power Sector Vision 2030, which prioritizes expanded renewable energy use, improved rural electricity access, and stronger financial sustainability in the power sector. In addition, the program will be supplemented by a \$40 million concessional loan from the Clean Technology Fund (CTF), administered by ADB.
