Glimpses of 11th, 12th & 13th International Conference cum Awards on Civil Aviation

































India is expected to overtake China and the United States as the world's third-largest air passenger market in the next ten years, by 2030, according to the International Air Transport Association (IATA). Further, the rising demand in the sector has pushed the number of airplanes operating in the sector. The number of airplanes is expected to reach 1,100 planes by 2027.

Historically, the air traffic was concentrated in the key metro cities. However, the post-pandemic growth is expected to be driven by traffic by tier 1 cities and lower. The government has already taken note of this fact and has taken steps to improve infrastructure in these cities and towns. As part of the RCS scheme, number of small airports have been opened and incentives have also been extended to boost connectivity and increase the flight inflow to/ from special focus areas. In a similar vein, the government has undertaken several policy measures to boost other areas such as MROs and Lessors.

While Indian aviation is receiving a significant impetus from government policies, there are certain issues that need to be resolved and certain opportunity areas that can be tapped to sustain the momentum.

In this connection, the ASSOCHAM is organizing 14th International Conference cum Awards on Civil Aviation on Wednesday, 18th January 2023 at New Delhi from 9:00 am to 6:00 pm. This conference outlines prominent pain points that the industry is facing and specific solutions for the government to relieve stress from Civil Aviation Sector, make it self sustainable and economically viable.

Session 1: Creation of International Hub In India

Points for Discussion

- * Rationalizing the current bilateral regime to promote hub development
- Streamlining VISA & immigration norms
- Introducing joint promotions of brand India by Govt and Indian carriers
- Airport Processes: Traditionally, terminals were primarily built for O&D Traffic and may not be adequate to handle transfer pax. Ensure focus on creating transfer areas and process improvement (CISF etc.) to hasten the processing times

Session 2: Implementation of Digi Yatra

Points for Discussion

- Balancing passenger privacy concerns with need to increase safety & security
- Promoting interoperability with international standards
- Incentivizing or subsidizing stakeholders for incurring software & infrastructure expenditure
- Increasing or nurturing use of indigenously developed systems in digi-yatra

Session 3: Drones and UAVs

Points for Discussion

- Developing a Robust Ecosystem for drone manufacturers: Boosting indigenous content (hardware & software) in manufactured drones
- Incentivizing the export of drones manufactured in India
- Developing protocols to spur efficient and safe usage of airspace by drone operators as adoption rates grow

Session 4: Skilling and Safety

Points for Discussion

- Development of a robust education ecosystem to train a large number of pilots, cabin crew, engineers, flight dispatchers, and other ancillary staff to utilize the incoming new fleet
- Upgrading Airport Infra, runway length
