This transformation aligns closely with the Government's 5F Vision: *Farm to Fibre to Factory to Fashion to Foreign*, which aims to create an integrated and globally competitive textile value chain. Simultaneously, evolving international frameworks such as the EU Green Deal, Extended Producer Responsibility (EPR), Digital Product Passport requirements, CBAM, and mandatory ESG disclosures are reshaping global trade and market access. Sustainability, traceability, and compliance are becoming central business imperatives across the textile industry.

Against this backdrop, ASSOCHAM is organizing the **"Farm to Foreign Conclave"** with the theme: **"Advancing India's 5F Vision for Sustainable & Traceable Textile Value Chains"** on **August 19, 2026 in Mumbai**.
