Andhra Pradesh

Andhra Pradesh govt launches Price Support Scheme

The Andhra Pradesh government has launched a Price Support Scheme to procure jowar at the minimum support price (MSP) of INR3,371 per quintal for the rabi 2024-25 season. The aim is to prevent distress sales by farmers as market prices are expected to fall.

Andhra Pradesh govt to double aid provided during fishing ban

The Andhra Pradesh government has launched the 'Matsyakara Cheyutha' scheme. The aim is to provide support to fishermen during the annual fishing ban period. Under the initiative, the financial assistance previously provided to eligible fishermen families has been doubled from INR10,000 to Rs.20,000 per annum.

The Chhattisgarh government has issued a directive empowering district registrars and subregistrars with the authority to execute land transfer deeds based on registered sales. The move aims to ease the process of land ownership transfer.

As part of the universal immunisation programme, the first dose of the measles & rubella vaccine is given to a child at 9-12 months and the second dose at 16-24 months to ensure protection.

Goa



Goa govt proposes hike of 5.9 per cent in power tariff for FY 2025-26

The Goa electricity department has proposed a hike of 5.9 per cent in power tariff across all categories of consumers for the financial year (FY) 2025-26. The department proposed a hike in fixed charges from Rs.20 per KW per month to Rs.20.6 for low tension domestic consumers.

Goa is set to get its first Veterinary College which will commence operations in the upcoming academic year. The CM has directed the concerned officials to adhere to strict timelines and ensure seamless coordination with the Centre.

The plan includes the procurement of advanced arms & equipment, image & video enhancement software, facial recognition & comparison software, polygraph system with accessories, next-generation sequencer etc.

The Haryana government has decided to set up compressed biogas (CBG) plants in 11 sugar mills across the state. These plants will convert residue generated by sugar mills into biogas. The sugar mills selected for the installation of these plants are located in Panipat, Shahabad, Karnal, Rohtak, Sonipat, Jind, Palwal, Meham, Kaithal, Gohana and Assandh.

Haryana introduces OTS scheme to offer tax relief, waive penalties for traders

Under the scheme, a taxpayer with an outstanding tax liability of INR1 million would need to pay only INR360,000 after availing a waiver of INR100,000 and shall be required to pay only 40 per cent of the remaining amount.



Himachal Pradesh



Himachal Pradesh govt to spend INR20 billion on agriculture and horticulture

The State Government has decided to spend INR20 billion to strengthen the agriculture and horticulture sectors and boost rural economy. The Him Ganga Yojana has been launched on a pilot basis in Hamirpur and Kangra districts with an aim to increase milk production.

Himachal Pradesh govt bans PET bottles from 1 June

The state government has banned polyethylene terephthalate (PET) bottles from 1 June 2025. This decision has been taken keeping in view the widespread use of PET water bottles that have raised significant environmental concerns due to the high potential for littering.

The Himachal Pradesh government has introduced natural farming cess on liquor under its new excise policy. A cess of INR2 per bottle will be imposed on desi liquor, while foreign & Indian-made foreign liquor (IMFL) will carry a cess of INR5 per bottle.

Karnataka govt to distribute 100,000 title deeds to residents of tandas, hattis

The Karnataka government has decided to distribute around 100,000 title deeds to residents living in tandas and hattis on 20 May 2025. The plan is to distribute title deeds to 200,000 families by the end of this year.

Karnataka govt set to confiscate illegal residential layouts

The Karnataka government is all set to confiscate illegal residential layouts, following the Supreme Court (SC) directions. This will be applicable only to those layouts coming up now and in the future, said state revenue minister Krishna Byre Gowda. On 17 December 2024, the SC had stated that unauthorised constructions cannot be legitimised merely due to administrative delays, passage of time or monetary investment.

Odisha



Odisha Cabinet approves Rs.1 billion for Anandapur Barrage Project

The Odisha Cabinet has approved INR1 billion for the Anandapur Barrage Project. The aim is to irrigate 60,000 hectares in Keonjhar and Balasore districts. The state Cabinet has also amended the Odisha Children's and Women's Welfare Service Rules.

The procurement of paddy for rabi season in 20 districts of Odisha will begin on 1 May and conclude on 30 June 2025. The information was shared by state chief secretary Manoj Ahuja on 25 April 2025. Madhya Pradesh



MP govt not to give benefits to farmers engaged in stubble burning

The state has decided not to give benefits under the CM Kisan Kalyan Scheme to farmers who engage in stubble burning. Also, their crops will not be purchased at the MSP. The decision will come into effect from 1 May 2025. Notably, the eligible farmers of the state receive monetary assistance of INR6,000 every year under the scheme.

Electric buses likely to be introduced in 6 major cities of Madhya Pradesh

Electric buses are likely to be introduced in six major cities of Madhya Pradesh. These include Bhopal, Jabalpur, Gwalior, Ujjain and Sagar. These buses are part of a central government initiative to launch over 6,500 e-buses in 88 cities across India. The bus fares will be cheaper compared to the current local buses.

ELCOT to roll out distribution of free laptops/tablets to 1 college students

The Electronics Corporation of Tamil Nadu (ELCOT) will roll out the distribution of free laptops or tablets to one million college students in Tamil Nadu. A sum of INR20 billion has been allocated for the same in the state Budget for the financial year (FY) 2025-26.

Kerala

Kerala govt to revamp IPR policy after 17 years

The Kerala government has decided to revamp its Intellectual Property Rights (IPR) policy after 17 years. The policy would feature a new Traditional Knowledge Authority, a Docketing System and the launch of Mission IPR to boost intellectual property (IP) administration. A draft of the IPR policy proposes wide-ranging reforms aimed at modernising the state's IP governance framework.

The state has amended the liquor rules to permit the sale of legal alcohol in designated IT parks. It initiated a new sub-rule to introduce Foreign Liquor Information Technology Park Lounge Licence. The licence shall be granted in the name of developers of the IT park.

India Meteorological Department (IMD) has forecast heatwave conditions over Rajasthan, Madhya Pradesh, Haryana and Punjab during next four days. It has also predicted hot and humid weather is likely to prevail over Bihar, Jharkhand, Kerala, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry and Coastal Andhra Pradesh.

Punjab

The information was shared by state good governance and information technology minister Aman Arora on 25 April 2025. The main objective is to bring all the offline services onto a unified online portal, enabling citizens to apply anytime, from anywhere.

The Punjab government has hiked the monthly honorarium for sarpanches to Rs.2,000. Besides this, the state government has decided to overhaul the Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme (MGNREGS). Telangana to reintroduce crop insurance scheme in upcoming kharif season

The Telangana government is planning to reintroduce the comprehensive crop insurance scheme in the ensuing kharif season. The state, which opted out of the Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana (PMFBY) in 2020, has decided to rejoin the central scheme. Under the scheme, farmers would have to pay a two per cent premium for their kharif crops and 1.5 per cent on their rabi crops, with the rest being shared by the state and central governments.
